- 1. To introduce the students to the essential structures of reading, writing, speaking and listening.
- 2. To expose the student to literature with special focus on social sensibility.
- 3. To discuss the ways in which media structure social reality and apparatuses for perception.
- 4. To update the student on the current equations of power, politics and other nuanced aspects of social formation.
- 5. To sensitize the student to economic, ecological and gender issues which play a crucial role in deciding the composition of the world.
- 6. To help the student community the skills which are decisive in getting a job and sustaining it.

#### Course objectives

#### Course 01:ENG1CMR01 – The Four Skills for Communication (Sem I)

- 1. To comprehensively discuss the features of language and communication.
- 2. To provide the student with the ability to use English language accurately and effectively through writing techniques.
- 3. To introduce speech sounds of English in order to enable them to listen to English and speak with global intelligibility.
- 4. To help the students improve their reading efficiency by refining their reading strategies.
- 5. To train the student to speak English confidently and effectively in a wide variety of situations.

#### Course 02:ENG1ENGCMR02 – Reading Literature in English (Sem I)

- 1. To acquaint the learners with different forms/genres of literature.
- 2. To enable the students to develop an ability to understand and appreciate literary pieces.
- 3. To sensitize students to the aesthetic, cultural and social aspects of literature.

- 4. To develop an appreciation of the subtle nuances of literary expression.
- 5. To improve the use of language as a means of subjective expression.

#### Course 03:ENG2CMR03-Media and Society (Sem II)

- 1. To provide the students an awareness of contemporary cultural and social movements through writings on media.
- 2. To equip the students to appreciate print, visual and online media through a socio-cultural perspective.
- 3. To facilitate learners to respond in English language to the various issues in and around India.
- 4. To engage the students through an understanding of advertisements and socially responsible reality shows.
- 5. To enable the student to comprehend the changing paradigm in media studies.

#### Course 04:ENG2CMR04 – Readings on Contemporary Issues (Sem II)

- 1. To create an awareness in the students regarding the challenges in the modern society.
- 2. To mould the students into responsible and dutiful citizens.
- 3. To develop a progressive and constructive perspective regarding human rights, environmental, legal and other vital issues in the students.
- 4. To sensitize students about the existing challenges in society.
- 5. To initiate discussions on important issues of gender, environment, human rights, etc.

#### Course 05: ENG3CMR05 – Reflections on Global Issues (Sem III)

- 1. To sensitize students to the aesthetic, cultural and social aspects of Indian culture.
- 2. To inculcate among the learners an appreciation and reverence for the Gandhian values and imbibe his principles of non-violence and cooperation.
- 3. To familiarize the students with the ethos of Indian culture and the issues of globalization.

- 4. To enable the learners to revalue secularist philosophy in the backdrop of communal frenzy in the present world
- 5. To acquaint the students with the secularist ideology and other issues related to it.

#### Course 05:ENG4CMR06 – English for Job Seekers Issues (Sem IV)

- 1. To equip the students with the communication tools requisite for attaining jobs and enable them to cope up with the escalating competitions and challenges in the globalized world.
- 2. To facilitate among the learners a sense of confidence to face the challenges of the society.
- 3. To urge the learners to develop a comprehensive understanding of grammar and enhance their writing skills by exposing them to finer techniques of writing.
- 4. To equip the students with better interview skills and foster their adaptability, performativity and efficiency skills in Group Discussion and interviews.
- 5. To familiarise the students with the different features of Content writing preparing them to face the challenges of the massive IT world.

# Programme Specific Outcome: B.A. English Language and Literature (Core)

- 1. To lay a solid and comprehensive foundation for the historical evolution of English literatures produced in the UK and other spaces.
- 2. To ensure the student gains meaningful, organic and productions perspectives with which s/he can look at literature and related social mechanisms in new ways.
- 3. To introduce the student to the historical, grammatical and stylistic features of the English language.
- 4. To familiarise the student with new avenues in literary production and how they engage with other aspects of the society.
- 5. To discuss how literature is produced and consumed in spaces which are marginalized in terms of caste, gender and region.

### **Course objectives**

### Course 01:ENG1ENGCMCORR01—History of English Literature up to 17<sup>th</sup> Century (Metaphysical) (Sem I)

- 1. To give the students a comprehensive knowledge about the background of English language and literature.
- 2. To acquaint the students with the different periods in the history of English literature up to the seventeenth century.
- 3. To nurture the ability among the students to appreciate, interpret and critically evaluate literature.
- 4. To aid the students to form an idea about the various stages in the development of English literature.
- 5. To initiate the students into literary history through Metaphysical poetry and prose.

#### Course 02:ENG1COR02 – English Literature: 18th and 19th Century (Sem II)

- 1. To enhance the student's knowledge base about the background of English language and literature of the 18th and 19th century.
- 2. To unearth the potential among the students to appreciate, interpret and critically evaluate literature of the period.
- 3. To equip the students to form an idea about the various genres of English literature.
- 4. To initiate the students into Romantic poetry and prose.
- 5. To enable the students to identify the features of romanticism and its ideals through literature.

#### Course 03:ENG3COR03—Literary Criticism Part I (Sem III)

- 1. To familiarize the students with the nuances and subtleties of English literature of the Seventeenth century from different parts of the world.
- 2. To enable the learners to appreciate, interpret and critically evaluate literature with theoretical insight.
- 3. To instil a holistic critical sensibility among the students, equipping them with analytical perspectives of the major theoretical trends of the twentieth century.

- 4. To help the students gain an insightful perception of the literary and aesthetic aspects of literature.
- 5. To instil in them the required and suitable analytical/critical perspectives on the social, cultural and intellectual climate of the period and to demonstrate how Enlightenment impacted on the contemporary literary production.
- 6. To trace the slow but unmistakable ascendancy of prose as the principal format for serious academic and intellectual discussions of the day.

#### Course 04:ENG3COR04-Explorations in Reading and Writing (Sem III)

- 1. To introduce the students to different kinds of fiction and to help them appreciate fiction.
- 2. To explore the creative process through writing and to define/determine individual goals as a writer.
- 3. To enable the students to expand and refine vocabulary and style resources. To familiarise the learners with the conventions of craft specific to each genre
- 4. To expose the learners to the varied techniques of fiction, non-fiction & poetry and to help them learn the art of critiquing (and be critiqued) constructively.
- 5. To reinforce among the learners the revising skills both of language and of ideas.

#### Course 05:ENG4COR05—Prose and Fiction (Sem IV)

- 1. To develop the critical bent of mind among the learners to capture the realities of human world.
- 2. To help the learners evaluate the different social, political, historical, economical and philosophical contexts reflected in literary works.
- 3. To enable them to write and appreciate different types of prose belonging to different social milieu.
- 4. To equip the students to critically analyze and interpret the nuances of narration in prose and fiction.

- 5. To facilitate among the learners to use English effectively with precision and clarity as reflected in prose writings.
- 6. To enable the learners to imbibe vivaciously the natural flow of speech and trigger their aesthetic sense lending the literary works an unusual appeal.

#### Course 06:ENG4COR06-Study of Poetry (Sem IV)

- 1. To enhance the level of critical thinking and appreciation of poems from different contexts and genres.
- 2. To introduce the students to the basic elements of poetry and the cadences of poetry.
- 3. To familiarize the students with various perspectives and readings of poems urging them to facilitate their power of imagination.
- 4. To capacitate the learners to critically interact with the different techniques and modes of articulation in poetry writing.
- 5. To expose the learners to the tremendous appeal of poetry exciting their love of language.

#### Course 07:ENG5COR07—Reading Drama (Sem V)

- 1. To develop in the students a taste for reading drama.
- 2. To get familiar with the plays of master-dramatists in the language.
- 3. To develop the ability to appreciate and evaluate various types of plays.
- 4. To equip the students with a practical knowledge of theatrical performances.

#### Course 08:ENG5COR08—Language and Linguistics (Sem V)

- 1. To impart an understanding of the structure of English language through a study of the internal organization of sound systems, words and sentences.
- 2. To help the students analyse the language, its sounds (phonetics and phonology), the way of forming words (morphology), the sentence structures (syntax), and the study of the meaning of words(semantics).

- 3. To impart an understanding of human communication through an objective study of language.
- 4. To familiarize students with the key concepts of linguistics and develop awareness of the latest trends in the area.
- 5. To help students acquire an intelligible pronunciation and to improve the standard of pronunciation in everyday conversation.

#### Course 09:ENG5COR09-Literary Criticism Part II (Sem V)

- 1. To familiarize the students with some of the key literary terms.
- 2. To introduce the students the fundamental and influential ideas that have a bearing on literary creation and understanding of literature.
- 3. To make them aware of the interdisciplinary nature of literary criticism.
- 4. To develop the skills for appreciating literature.
- 5. To develop a critical temper in students.
- 6. To help the students get in touch with various movements and schools of thought.
- 7. To develop an interdisciplinary approach.

#### Course 10: ENG5COR10 – American and Postcolonial Literatures (Sem V)

- 1. To familiarize the students with the basic tenets of Postcolonial theory and literature.
- 2. To inculcate in the student an awareness of diverse cultures and literatures, including that of American Literature.
- 3. To acquaint students with literary productions that address issues related to cultural identity in colonized societies, the development of a national identity after colonial domination, and the ways in which writers articulate and celebrate such identity.
- 4. To learn about the resistance of the colonized against the colonizer through literature that articulates it.
- 5. To enable students to compare and contrast their indigenous culture with other literatures and cultures.

#### Course 11: ENG5COR11 – Continental Literature (Sem V)

- 1. To inculcate in the pupil the basic idea of continental literary analysis.
- 2. To introduce various methods employed to identify shared features of various literatures.
- 3. To equip students to make comparative and contrastive analysis of literary texts.
- 4. To inspire students to read literary works from different social and cultural backgrounds.
- 5. To introduce the learner to the growth and development of literatures outside Britain.

#### Course 12: ENG6COR12 - Women's Literature (Sem VI)

- 1. To introduce students to women's writing in various countries.
- 2. To familiarize them with the diverse concerns addressed by feminism.
- 3. To motivate them to critically analyse literary works from a feminist perspective.
- 4. To create an awareness of class, race and gender as social constructs and about how they influence women's lives.
- 5. To acquire the skill to understand feminism as a social movement and a critical tool.
- 6. To explore the plurality of female experiences.
- 7. To equip students with analytical, critical and creative skills to interrogate the biases in the construction of gender and patriarchal norms.

#### Course 13: ENG6COR13 – Indian Literature in English (Sem VI)

- 1. To inspire students to read and appreciate Indian literature in English, and to explore its uniqueness and its place among the literatures in English.
- 2. To introduce to the students the nuances of the cultural representation in Indian Literature in English.
- 3. To provide an overview of the various phases of the evolution of Indian writing in English.

- 4. To introduce students to the thematic concerns, genres and trends of Indian writing in English.
- 5. To generate discussions on the constraints and challenges encountered in articulating Indian sensibility in English.
- 6. To expose students to the pluralistic aspects of Indian culture and identity.

#### Course 14: ENG6COR14—Comparative Literature (Sem VI)

- 1. To inculcate the basic idea of comparative literary analysis.
- 2. To familiarize students with the concepts and theories of comparative literary analysis.
- 3. To help students analyse and appreciate Malayalam literature both in the source and target language.
- 4. To help the students identify the shared features of various literatures.
- 5. To enable the students to make comparative and contrastive analysis of literary texts.

#### Course 15: ENG6COR15 – Commonwealth Literature (Sem VI)

- 1. To introduce students to the glorious masterpieces of American literature—its unique flavour, style, form and themes.
- 2. To motivate students to attempt an intelligent appreciation and critical evaluation of American civilization and culture as revealed in the works.
- 3. To inspire them to make further explorations into contemporary American literary works.
- 4. To acquire knowledge about American literature, its cultural themes, literary periods and key artistic features.
- 5. To understand the various aspects of American society through a critical examination of the literary texts representing different periods and cultures.

#### Course 16: ENG6COR16 – Dalit Literature (Sem VI)

1. To make the students aware of the recent trends in literature.

- 2. To inculcate the values of unity and broadmindedness.
- 3. To unravel the politically and culturally constructed ideologies hidden in the life of Subaltern sectors in our society.
- 4. To initiate students into a discussion of the cultural and social differences in literary texts.
