PREFACE

Adorned with the singular sheen of crowning glories, Maharaja's College, Ernakulam stands as a signature presence in the arena of institutions of higher education. Its rich legacy and consistent achievements in various fields of human activity envelop it with the halo of an outstanding temple of knowledge. Spread over a 25 acre campus, the College stands in the heart of the metro city of Kochi, with easy accessibility by road, rail, air or waterways. 1. CLASSIFICATION/CATEGORIZATION OF SEATS

1.1. Seats available in Under Graduate Programmes are classified as:

- i. Merit Seats
- ii. Sports Quota Seats
- iii. Cultural Quota Seats
- iv. Differently Abled Seats

2. RESERVATION OF SEATS

2.1 Types of Reservation - Out of the total Merit Seats available in U.G. Programmes, seats will be reserved for different categories as under:

- i. Reservation for Nominees
- ii. Reservation for Differently Abled Persons
- iii. Reservation for Transgender candidates
- iv. Reservation for Persons from Govt. Children's Homes and Institutions functioning under Juvenile Justice Act
- v. Special Reservation
- vi. Mandatory Reservation

- (i) **Reservation for Nominees:** An additional seat for each programme shall be created exclusively for the purpose of accommodating students sponsored by the Union Territory of Lakshadweep. Applicants to this quota should produce the nomination letter from the Union Territory of Lakshadweep. **This seat shall not be filled up by other candidates. The students who seek admission to this category should apply online.**
- (ii) **Reservation for Differently Abled Persons:** 5% seats of the sanctioned strength shall be created over and above in all programmes exclusively for candidates with benchmark disability (as per clause 32 (1) of chapter VI, The Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016). If candidates are not available in a particular category, the seats shall not be filled from any other categories. **The students who seek admission in this category should apply online.**

'Persons with Disabilities' means a person suffering from not less than 40% of any disability as certified by a Medical Board constituted for this purpose. Candidates who have a minimum of 40% disability alone will be eligible for this quota. A relaxation of 5% marks in the qualifying examination from the prescribed minimum is allowed.

Candidates seeking admission under Persons with Disabilities category should submit the "Certificate of disability", issued not earlier than 5 years prior to the submission of application, by the District Medical Board or bodies of higher status, certifying the degree of percentage of disability. The Permanent Disability Card issued by the State Government is also considered. Based on the details furnished in the online application, candidates will be provisionally included under the "Differently Abled Persons" category. Candidates seeking admission under Differently Abled Persons category should upload with their application form, an attested copy of the

‘Certificate of disability’ issued by a District Medical Board or bodies of higher status, certifying the degree or percentage of disability.

The selection of candidates under this category will be based on the rank in the inter-se-merit list and not on the basis of the degree of disability.

No reservation of seats is allowed for Blind candidates for Programmes which come under the Faculties of Science

- (iii) **Reservation for Transgender Candidates:** Two seats shall be created over and above the sanctioned strength in all courses exclusively for admitting Transgender students. (G.O.(Ms)No.153/2018 H.Edn dated03.07.2018). **However, such students should also apply online.**
- (iv) **Reservation for Persons from Govt. Children’s Homes and Institutions functioning under Juvenile Justice Act:** One seat shall be created over and above the sanctioned strength in the college exclusively for admitting candidates from Government Children’s Homes and Institutions functioning under Juvenile Justice Act. Such students should submit certificates to claim proof of reservation. **However, such students should also apply online.**
- (v) **Special Reservation:** The seats reserved under Sports Quota and Cultural Quota come under this category. **The applicants under this category should register online and upload self-attested copies of the relevant documents as a single PDF file.**
- (a) **Sports Quota:** Two seats in each programme (Interchangeable) shall be reserved for candidates with outstanding records in sports & games. However, not more than 20 % of the seats reserved for the general quota seats of a particular programme shall not be filled for sports quota, when applying interchangeability for a particular programme. The applicant for admission to this reservation quota should have won a minimum of third position (Bronze medal) in the school sub district competition (inter-school) in addition to his/her satisfying the academic eligibility.

Preference shall be given to Sportsmen who have represented the State/National School Meet over the sportsmen who have represented the District/School. The applicant shall produce the relevant certificate to prove District representation.

The applicants under this category should register online and upload self-attested copies of the relevant documents as a single PDF file.

Age Limit: *Upper age limit for applying through sports quota is 25 years.*

The following guidelines shall be followed in determining merit in sports for admission to the UG programmes. Marks shall be awarded for the sports merit certificates as detailed in the following Table.

A) Minimum eligibility for admission of a candidate to undergraduate programmes (Sports Quota) will be winning a minimum of third position in the school sub district competition (Inter-school) in addition to his/her satisfying academic eligibility.

B) For securing admission to UG programmes under Sports Quota, the performance of the candidate at **11th and 12th standards alone** will be considered.

Addendum

1. Achievement in those sports disciplines/events in M G University Sports calendar shall only be considered for UG sports quota admission.
2. An approved world competition means the competitions organized by the International Apex Bodies of the concerned discipline and in which the National Teams are sponsored by the National Apex Bodies and cleared by Sports Authority of India/ Government of India.
3. The National Championship means the championships conducted by the National Apex Bodies of the concerned discipline. District Competition means Revenue District competition conducted by district associations in respective sports.
4. Individual games /event means a game/event in which individual performs alone.
5. When a candidate has more than one achievement in a sports /different discipline his/ her best achievement will be taken in to consideration.
6. Any competitions where an upper age limit is fixed (Youth/Junior/Sub-Junior) would be treated as Junior event provided it is not classified as senior event by the concerned National Federation.
7. Priority will be given for students having achievements in senior level competitions than junior and youth category competitions.
8. Resolving of Tie:

If the points of more than one candidate happen to be the same, then for breaking the “tie”, the following criteria shall be followed one after another in the order given below:

- a) A person can score points only in one category.
- b) The highest score will be counted
- c) Where bracketed, scores in other categories will be counted
- d) Where still bracketed, priority will be given in the order of merit i.e.; 1st, 2nd, and 3rdplace respectively.
- e) Those with a more number of achievements in the same level will be placed above the others (more number of 1stplaces, more number of 2ndplaces and so on).
- f) Individual achievements will be ranked above team achievements.
- g) A new record is created; he/she will be given priority.

If the tie could not be resolved by any of the above-mentioned sports achievements, the index marks based on the qualifying examination shall be considered for breaking the tie.

9. Performance in any year during the Plus One/Plus Two level will be taken into consideration.
10. If any discrepancy is noted during the verification of original certificates, the candidate shall not be considered for admission under sports quota.

(b) Cultural Quota: - One seat for each degree programme (Interchangeable) shall be reserved for students who excel in Youth festival recognized by Director of Public Instruction (DPI). However, not more than 10 % of the seats reserved for the general quota seats of a particular programme shall be filled for cultural quota when applying interchangeability for a particular programme.

The applicants under this category should register online and upload self-attested copies of the relevant documents as a single PDF file while applying.

The selection shall be made from among the applicants for the cultural quota on merit as detailed in the following table:

If vacancies arise due to discontinuation of candidates under Sports/Cultural/Differently Abled Persons quotas, the next eligible candidate in the Rank List shall be admitted. In case there is no next eligible candidate, the vacant seat Sports/Cultural quotas shall be merged with the general merit quota.

vi. Mandatory Reservation: Leaving the seats set apart for special reservation, the remaining seats for each programme will be distributed as per the G.O.(Ms) No.107/08/H.Edn dated 30.8.2008 as given in the following table:

EWS Category

10% of the total seats in Government Colleges/Self-financing Programmes are reserved for applicants belonging to Economically Weaker section. For availing the benefit of reservation under this category the annual family income of the applicant shall not exceed the prescribed limit i.e. four lakhs as stipulated in GO (MS)No. 128/2020/H Edn dated 20/03/2020.

**For the limited purpose of reservation, under this category, candidates belonging to all those communities which do not enjoy communal reservation will be eligible vide UO No. 3047/AC A1/2020/MGU dated 07/07/2020. Candidates who wish to avail reservation under EWS will have to produce the Income & Assets Certificate from the Village officer concerned.*

After admitting the eligible candidates under sports and cultural quota, the College shall deduct an equal number of seats from the General Merit quota.

3. CLAIMS FOR MANDATORY RESERVATION AND CERTIFICATES TO BE PRODUCED

Claims for Mandatory Reservations must be made by a candidate at the time of submission of application. The claims for mandatory reservation once made in the Application form cannot be altered later by the candidate under any circumstances. **There is no need to submit supporting documents to claim Mandatory Reservation.**

3.1 Claim for Communal reservation under ‘Kerala Socially and Educationally Backward Classes’ (KSEBC): Reservation of seats to the Socially and Educationally Backward Classes will be in accordance with the provisions contained in G.O. (P) 208/66/Edn. dated 2.5.1966, as amended from time to time.

- (a) Candidates belonging to Socially and Educationally Backward Classes as per G.O. (P) 02/2019/BCDD dated 08.03.2019, who belong to the non-creamy layer are eligible for reservation under this category. The non-creamy layer certificate should have been issued not earlier than 12 months prior to the submission of application. Only the claims of the candidates of those communities that are included in the list of communities appended in the Prospectus will be considered.
- (b) Candidates belonging to Ezhava, Muslim, Other Backward Hindus, Latin Catholic / Anglo Indians and Other Backward Christian communities, claiming reservation under SEBC Quota should invariably produce both ‘**Community**’ and ‘**Income Certificates**’ or **non-creamy layer certificate** obtained from the Village Officer concerned. Candidates who belong to the non-creamy layer are eligible for reservation. The seats unavailed by SEBC category candidates will be allotted under State merit.

3.2 Claims for Reservation under Kerala Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes Quota:-

Candidates claiming reservation under Kerala Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes Quota” should obtain caste/community certificate from the revenue authority concerned.

3.3 Other General Rules for Mandatory Reservation:

The seats unavailed by the SC candidates will go to ST candidates and vice versa. The unavailed seats reserved for SC/ST shall be re-notified twice through print media and a special allotment shall be conducted exclusively for filling up vacant seats of SC/ST candidates. If such seats are remaining vacant even after re-notification, these shall be filled up from candidates belonging to OEC. (See Appendix 4).

Claim of OEC candidates against the unavailed seats of SC/ST candidates:

Other Eligible Community (OEC, See Appendix 4) candidates who claim allotment to the unavailed seats, if any, under SC/ST quota should furnish community and income certificates obtained from the Village Officer concerned. Those OEC candidates whose annual family income is up to 8 lakhs (Rupees Eight lakhs only) alone are eligible for such seats (GO MS. No. 14/2017/PVVV dated 02.08.2017) Candidates belonging to other eligible communities are exempted from payment of fee at the time of allotment to UG Degree Programmes under Government/Community quota irrespective of annual family income as per G.O. (Ms) No.36/07/SCSTDD dated 03.07.2007. They should provide Community Certificate from the Village Officer concerned.

4. ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

Academic eligibility should be satisfied as on the last date of submission of online application form. In the case of candidates who have passed examinations of other Boards/Institutes/Governments, except CBSE/CISCE, they shall be admitted only if these examinations have been declared equivalent to the qualifying examinations of MG University.

Age Limit :There is no upper and lower age limit for admission to undergraduate programmes. However, the upper age limit for admission through sports quota is 25 years.

If an applicant for admission is found to have indulged in ragging in the past or if it is noticed later that he/she had indulged in ragging, admissions shall be denied or he/she shall be expelled from the educational institution.

No candidate shall be admitted to the degree programme unless he/she possesses the qualifications and minimum requirements thereof.

4.1 B.A Degree Programmes

Admission to all B.A. Degree Programmes under the faculties of Language & Literature and Social Sciences shall be open only to candidates who have passed Higher Secondary or equivalent examination or an examination recognized by the Mahatma Gandhi University as equivalent thereto.

For **B.A. Sanskrit** : Programme, in addition to the above qualifications, candidates should have working knowledge in Sanskrit and studied Sanskrit at least at SSLC or equivalent examinations.

For **B.A. Arabic** : Programme, in addition to the above qualifications, the candidates should have working knowledge in Arabic and studied Arabic in Secondary/Higher Secondary / equivalent course.

With regard to B.A.Economics (Honours) programme, minimum marks required for qualifying examination is 60 percent for SC, 55 percent for ST and 70 percent for all other categories (G.O. (Ms.) No.:378/2013/H.Edn Dated 26.06.2013).

4.1.3 Programmes under Fine Arts

1. B.A. Music

Admission to B.A. Music Programme shall be open to candidates who have passed Higher Secondary or equivalent examination or an examination recognized by the Mahatma Gandhi University as equivalent thereto. In addition, candidates' basic knowledge in Carnatic Music (from saptaswaras to alankaras)will be tested by conducting an Aptitude Test.

4.2 Programmes under Faculty of Science

Admission to all B.Sc. Degree programmes shall be open only to candidates who have passed the Higher Secondary or equivalent examination or an examination recognized by M.G. University as equivalent thereto with the main subject they propose to offer for the B.Sc. programme as one of the subjects. The eligibility criteria for admission to conventional programmes and cost sharing programmes are as follows.

1. **B.Sc. Botany (Model I):** Candidates shall be required to have passed the Higher Secondary/equivalent examination with Biology as one of the optional subjects at Higher Secondary level.
2. **B.Sc. Chemistry (Model I):** Candidates shall be required to have passed the Higher Secondary/equivalent examination with Chemistry as one of the optional subjects at Higher Secondary level.
3. **B.Sc. Chemistry-Environment and Water Management, Model III (Vocational Cost Sharing Course):** Candidates shall be required to have passed the Higher Secondary/equivalent examination with Chemistry and Mathematics as optional subjects at Higher Secondary level.
4. **B.Sc. Mathematics (Model I):** Candidates shall be required to have passed the Higher Secondary/equivalent examination with Mathematics as one of the optional subjects or Mathematics as one of the subjects in Commerce group.
5. **B.Sc. Physics (Model I):** Candidates shall be required to have passed the Higher Secondary/equivalent examination with Physics as one of the optional subjects at Higher Secondary level.
6. **B.Sc. Physics-Instrumentation, Model III (Vocational Cost Sharing Course):** Candidates shall be required to have passed the Higher Secondary/equivalent examination with Physics as one of the optional subjects at Higher Secondary level.
7. **B.Sc. Zoology (Model I):** Candidates shall be required to have passed the Higher Secondary/equivalent examination with Biology as one of the optional subjects at Higher Secondary level.

4.3 Programmes under Faculty of Commerce

1. B.Com. (Model II – Vocational) Finance and Taxation:

Admission to the B.Com Degree Programmes shall be open only to candidates who have passed the Higher Secondary or equivalent examination recognized by MG University with Book-Keeping and Accountancy and any two of the following subjects, viz., (1) Commerce (2) Commercial Correspondence and Commercial Geography (3) Economics (4) Life Insurance with Salesmanship (5) Banking with Secretarial Practice (6) Business Studies (7) Mathematics (8) Computer Science/ Computer applications (9) Informatics Practice & Management (10) Informatics Practice (11) Management (12) Accountancy as optional under Part III of the Examination.

OR

Candidates who have passed Higher Secondary or equivalent examination recognized by this University with other subjects under Part III optional subjects provided they have secured 45% of the aggregate marks.

4.4 Integrated Programme

1. Integrated Postgraduate Programmes in Archaeology and Material Culture Studies

Candidates shall be required to have passed the Higher Secondary / equivalent examination.

5. HOW TO APPLY

5.1 Application for admission to all the Under Graduate Programmes can be registered only online through a single application. The provision for applying online is available at the website www.maharajas.ac.in or www.maharajasonline.kerala.gov.in

Submission of more than one online application by a candidate will lead to rejection of the candidature.

5.2 Application Fee:

The application fee will be as follows:

For candidates except SC and ST : Rs. 100/-

For SC and ST students :Rs. 50/-

Application fee can be remitted by all applicants through the **online payment gateway** during the process of submission of online application form.

The application fee once remitted will not be refunded under any circumstances.

5.3 Availability of Prospectus

Prospectus and all appendices can be downloaded from the website www.maharajas.ac.in or www.maharajasonline.kerala.gov.in It will not be available by post or from the Office of the Principal, Maharaja's College, Ernakulam or from any other office. Before submitting the application form candidate should read the Prospectus. Since the communications from the college are through email id and SMS utmost care should be given while entering your email id and mobile number.

5.4 Submission of Application Form

5.4.1 Stages in the Submission of Application Form

Stage 1- Registration of Personal Data

- Click on 'UG PROGRAMME'
- Provide all the required information with utmost care. No further editing will be allowed.

- OTP will be sent to the registered email and mobile number for verification
- After providing all the required information, Click on 'CONFIRM' button to proceed further
- Application ID will be generated and the same will be sent to the registered mobile number and e-mail id. Please note down the application ID for future reference.
- Username will be your registered email id.

Stage 2- Remittance of application fee

Pay the registration fee through online payment gateway.

Stage 3- Entry of Basic and Other Details

- **Basic Details(including OEC, LDST, Govt. Children's Home/ Institutes under juvenile act etc.)**
- **Communication Address**
- **Permanent Address**
- **Contact Details**
- **Other Details (NCC, NSS, Scouts, Guides, Rover & Ranger, Student Police Cadet, Ex-Servicemen, Differently-Abled Person, Sports Quota, Cultural Quota)**

***NB: 1. NCC, NSS, Scouts, Guides, Rover & Ranger, Student Police Cadet, certificates during higher secondary level
2. Candidates who are applying under Differently- Abled, Sports Quota and Cultural Quota shall upload self-attested copies of the relevant documents as a single PDF file***

After entering all the above information, first Click 'SAVE' button and then proceed to 'NEXT' button.

Stage 4- Upload Photo and Signature

Upload your recent passport size photograph (3.5 cm x 4.5 cm with the file size less than 30 KB) and Signature (3.5 cm x 1.5 cm with file size less than 30 KB) in jpg format.

Stage 5- Entry of Academic data

- Provide the Plus 2 level or equivalent qualification details
- Choose your Subjects as per mark list. If any subject/language name is not listed, choose Other subject/Other language. Candidates who have studied language as optional subject may choose corresponding PART III language.
- Click on 'CONFIRM' button and 'PROCEED'.

Stage 6- Entry of qualifying examination mark details

Enter the mark details as in qualifying examination marklist and click 'SUBMIT'

Stage 7- Programme Selection

A Candidate can select maximum of 5 programmes.

Stage 8- Order of Programme Preference

Choose the programme carefully as per your preference.

***Your allotment will be strictly on the basis of
your order of preference***

Stage 9- Verify and Confirm Selection

Verify your details furnished and the order of programmes preferred, click on 'Confirm Selection' button.

Stage 10- Final Submit

- Click on 'Final Submit' button
- Click on the 'Preview' button to view the application form (without application number).
- Read the declaration and tick the check box to enable the 'Confirm button'.
- Click on 'Confirm' button. Now your application is submitted successfully.
- Print application form (with application number).

The printout of the application form (with application number) should be submitted at the time of admission (Hardcopy of the application form). Those candidates who fail to 'final submit' their application form will not be considered for admission.

***Candidates are requested to keep the Password and
Registration ID strictly confidential to protect their interest.***

6. PREPARATION OF RANK LIST

The Rank List shall be prepared on the basis of ranking marks arrived at as follows:

- 6.1 Handicap of Five marks for every successive attempt after the first attempt subject to a maximum of twenty marks will be deducted from the total marks in the case of those who have taken two or more chances to complete the examination. The number of chances

means the number of chances taken for passing any part of the qualifying examination after the prescribed programme period.

Appearance for improvement of marks shall not be considered as an additional chance.

- 6.2 No marks will be deducted for SAY pass outs if admitted in the same academic year but five marks shall be deducted if he/she is ranked in the admission list of the succeeding year.

Candidates who have passed the qualifying examination under SAY scheme or such supplementary scheme are eligible to apply for the UG programmes in the same academic year, but they have to produce the mark lists on or before the closing date of admission.

6.3 Resolving of Tie

If the index marks of more than one candidate happen to be the same, then for breaking the 'tie', the following criteria shall be followed one after another in the order given below:

1. The candidate who has scored higher marks in the concerned elective subject shall be placed higher in the rank list. For B.Com programme, Business Studies (Commerce) shall be considered as the Elective subject.
2. The candidate who has scored higher marks for Part III Subjects (or the Subjects other than Languages, if Part is not specified) taken together shall be placed higher in the rank list.
3. The candidate who has scored higher marks in Part I (English if Part is not specified) shall be placed higher in the rank list.
4. The candidate who has scored higher marks in Part II (Second Language if Part is not specified) shall be placed higher in the rank list.
5. By giving residential weightage (at District/State Levels)
6. Preference shall be given to candidates who are elder, and the age difference shall be calculated in completed years only, rounding down fractions. (As candidates having difference in age less than one year happen to be admitted in the same class).

6.4 Bonus Marks

The Bonus Marks will be awarded as follows:

- I. A bonus of 15 marks shall be awarded to applicants with NCC or NSS or Scouts & Guides, or Rover & Ranger or Student Police Cadet Certificates at 'Higher Secondary level' for admission to all programmes.
 1. In respect of NCC candidates, the bonus marks will be awarded on the basis of NCC Certificates signed by the Director and issued by the Directorate of NCC to candidates who have secured at least 75% attendance after having participated in its activities during the programme of study immediately preceding the programme for which admission is sought. An additional bonus mark of 5 will be awarded to 'B' Certificate holders in proof of their high proficiency.
 2. In respect of NSS candidates, the bonus marks will be awarded on the basis of NSS Certificates issued by the competent authority.
 3. In respect of Scouts & Guides, or Rover & Ranger candidates the bonus marks shall be awarded to applicants with Rajyapuraskar/ Nanmamudra certificates.

4. In respect of Student Police Cadet candidates, the bonus marks will be awarded on the basis of SPC Certificates issued by the competent authority.
- II. A bonus of 15 marks shall be awarded to the Ex-servicemen applicants and widows and children of Jawans and Ex-servicemen seeking admission to the Degree Programmes. Applicants to this category should invariably produce along with the application form, an attested copy of certificate issued not earlier than six months from the last date of submission of application from the military authorities or state/Zilla Sainik Welfare Officer to the effect that he/she is the son/daughter of an ex-service man or an ex service man himself/herself.

The benefit of bonus marks can be scored by a candidate only under one category i.e., anyone of NCC or NSS or Scouts & Guides, or Rover & Ranger or Student Police Cadet.
Bonus marks shall be added only if the candidate has obtained the prescribed minimum qualifying marks in the qualifying examination while calculating the index marks.

6.5. Indexing of Marks

6.5.1. FACULTY OF LANGUAGE & LITERATURE

(i) B.A. English

Total marks obtained in the qualifying examination less handicap marks (for additional chances) plus twice the marks secured in Part I English of the Higher Secondary/equivalent examination plus weightage of 50 marks to those who have taken English as one of the optional for the qualifying exam plus bonus marks if any.*

(ii) B.A. in other Languages

Total marks obtained in the qualifying examination less handicap marks (for additional chances) plus twice the marks secured in Part II Second Language concerned at the qualifying languages examination plus weightage of 50 marks in the case of those who have taken the language concerned as optional for the qualifying examination plus bonus marks if any.*

6.5.2. FACULTY OF SOCIAL SCIENCES

Total marks obtained in the qualifying examination less handicap marks (for additional chances) plus the marks obtained for optional concerned at the qualifying examination plus a subject weightage of 50 marks in the case of those who have taken the subject concerned at the qualifying examination plus bonus marks if any. The subject concerned for the award of 50 marks as weightage will be as indicated below:

(i) B.A. History and Islamic History

Weightage of 50 marks for History/Islamic History in the qualifying examination.*

(ii) B.A. Economics

Weightage of 50 marks for Economics. *

(iii) B.A. Honours Economics

Weightage of 50 marks for Economics. *

(iv) B.A. Political Science

Weightage of 50 marks for Politics/Political Science or Elements of Political Science/Gandhian Studies. *

(v) B.A. Philosophy

Weightage of 50 marks for Logic/Philosophy/Gandhian Studies*

(vi) B.A. Music

Marks obtained by the candidate in the Qualifying Examination and Aptitude Test conducted by the college shall be considered for calculating the index. There will be 50 percent weightage for the Qualifying Examination and 50 percent weightage for the Aptitude Test conducted by the college.***If a candidate has not qualified the aptitude test candidate will not be considered for allotment.**

6.5.3. FACULTY OF SCIENCE

B.Sc. Programmes

Total marks obtained in Part III of the qualifying examination less handicap marks(for additional chances) plus marks obtained for the particular subject concerned for which admission is sought plus bonus marks if any. *

6.5.4. FACULTY OF COMMERCE

B.Com. (Finance and Taxation)

Marks obtained in Part III Optional at Higher Secondary/equivalent exam less handicap marks(for additional chances)plus a weightage of 50 marks in each of the three subjects of Commerce combination subject to a maximum of 150 marks plus bonus marks if any.* The optional subjects concerned under Part III will be Commerce, Commercial Correspondence and Commercial Geography, Accountancy, Book Keeping and Accountancy, Economics, Life Insurance and Salesmanship, Banking with Secretarial Practice, Business Studies, Mathematics, Computer Science/Computer Application, Informatics Practice, Management, Informatics Practice & Management.

6.5.5 INTEGRATED PROGRAMME

Integrated Postgraduate Programme in Archaeology and Material Cultural Studies

Total marks obtained in the qualifying examination less handicap marks (for additional chances) plus bonus marks if any.

(* Marks obtained for the subjects in other streams, via, CBSE, CISCE etc shall be standardised to that of Kerala Higher Secondary Examination (i.e., 1200 marks). Index marks shall be calculated as mentioned in clause 6.5. But the marks obtained for vocational subjects in VHSE/THSE, etc. is to be excluded while calculating index marks.)

7. Publication of Provisional Rank List

Rank list for various programmes will be published in the **College Website only**. No interview cards will be sent to the selected students separately.

8.(i) Allotment Process (Off line mode)

- Publication of Sure Rank list (Provisional) and chance list
- Candidates included in the sure rank list (provisional) are required to **Accept** or **Decline the current allotted programme** through admission portal within the stipulated time through clicking respective buttons. Those candidates who are not accepting or declining the admission will be treated as **INACTIVE and they will be removed from the entire admission process of Maharaja's College**.
- The candidates who wish to join the allotted programme should Click the Accept option and should come to the college with relevant documents and take admission on the prescribed date. Such candidates have a chance to get higher option. If the candidates wish, they may cancel their higher options partially or fully through admission portal **before the next allotment**.
- Candidates included in the sure rank list (provisional) who are not willing to join in the allotted programme but wishes to get higher option should select the “Decline the current allotted programme” button. Such a candidate will lose the chance to get the admission of the allotted programme but has the chance to get higher options.
- Candidates included in the chance rank list shall select the **accept** option, if they wish to join the current allotted programme and wait for further intimation from the college.

8. (ii) Allotment Process (If we switch over the process to Online mode)

- Publication of Sure Rank list (Provisional) and chance list
- Candidates included in the sure rank list (provisional) are required to **Accept** or **Decline the current allotted programme** through admission portal within the stipulated time through clicking respective buttons. Those candidates who are not accepting or declining the admission will be treated as **INACTIVE and they will be removed from the entire admission process of Maharaja's College**.
- The candidates who wish to join the allotted programme should Click the Accept button and upload the relevant documents through the admission portal within the stipulated time.
- Verification of the uploaded documents by the college authority.

- Candidates selected, after verification process, will be informed through their registered e-mail id/mobile number to make the initial payment within the stipulated time through online via the admission portal. **If the candidate fails to remit the initial payment, his/her admission will be cancelled without any further notice.**
- Candidates included in the sure rank list (provisional) who are not willing to join in the allotted programme but wish to get higher option should select the “Decline the current allotted programme” button. Such a candidate will lose the chance to get the admission of the allotted programme but has the chance to get higher options.
- Candidates included in the chance rank list shall select the **accept** option, if they wish to join the current allotted programme and wait for further intimation from the college.

9. Reporting at the College for admission

Candidates who secure admission are required to report at the college on the date and time intimated for submitting relevant documents in original and balance fee payment. **Those who fail to report will be treated as Not Joined and further claim for admission and allotment by these applicants will not be entertained.**

Those candidates who selected the “Decline Current allotment” option will be considered as reported and they may not physically report at the college.

The candidates should produce the following documents in original at the time of admission.

Documents to be submitted

1. The Print out of the Application Form downloaded.
2. Six copies of recent passport size Photo.
3. Original and copy of Aadhar card.
4. Certificate to prove date of birth.
5. Transfer Certificate (TC) from the institution last attended and Conduct Certificate(**issued not earlier than six months**).
6. Marklist(s) of all parts of the Higher Secondary / equivalent examination.
7. Eligibility Certificate from Mahatma Gandhi University, in the case of candidates who have passed their qualifying examination from other Boards/Institutes/governments, except CBSE/CISCE
8. Migration Certificate, if applicable.
9. Caste certificate in the case of SC/ST candidates. Any other documents required to be produced by the Head of Institution.
10. Candidates belonging to Ezhava, Muslim, Other Backward Hindus, Latin Catholic including Anglo Indians and Other Backward Christian communities, claiming reservation under SEBC Quota should invariably produce both ‘Community’ and ‘Income Certificates’ or non-creamy layer certificate obtained from the Village Officer concerned.

11. Candidates who wish to avail reservation under EWS will have to produce the Income & Assets Certificate from the Village officer concerned.
12. Candidates who wish to avail bonus/weightage of marks shall produce the relevant certificates.
13. Course Cancellation certificate, if applicable.

The college authorities, after verifying the above documents, shall confirm the admission. The students who get admission should remit the fee applicable to the course in the institution at the time of admission through either online or offline mode specified by the college.

10. CANCELLATION OF HIGHER OPTION AFTER JOINING A PROGRAMME

Candidates who join the college on the date specified may cancel their remaining options fully or partially before a specified date. A candidate, not interested in any further allotments should cancel all his/her higher options through admission portal before the specified date of the subsequent allotment, failing which, the options will remain live and will be considered for further allotments, if any. A candidate who has not cancelled his/her higher options must go for the higher programme if he/she gets selected in the next allotment (**even if the candidate is not interested.**)

11. SEAT ALLOTMENT PROTOCOL

All candidates included in the Rank lists are eligible for allotment under State Merit (SM). Candidates might be entitled for other reservation quotas also under Mandatory Reservation. For example, a candidate may have the benefit of SEBC reservation (EZ/MU/OBH/LC/OBX) or Scheduled Caste (SC) or Scheduled Tribe (ST) claim. The seats will be offered on the hierarchy of quotas.

The hierarchy in order is as follows:

- State Merit (SM) – All candidates included in the Rank Lists are eligible for allotment under State Merit.
- Communal Reservation (SEBC/SC/ST).
- A candidate without SEBC/SC/ST reservation benefit will be considered only against the 'State Merit' seats wherever available at the time of allotment.

Any decision to be taken in any case during the admission process, which is not specified in the prospectus, shall be taken in accordance with the existing Government orders and Parent University rules and regulations.

12. FEE

Fee for various U.G. programmes in the College for the admission to 2022-23 batch is given in Table 12-1 and is also available in the College website. Fee for various programmes will be decided by the State Government and the amount given in the table is subject to changes.

- 12.1 Candidates belonging to SC/ST communities allotted against merit seats or against the seats reserved for them are exempted from payment of fee.
- 12.2 Candidates belonging to OEC admitted against merit seats or against the unavailed seats of SC/ST are exempted from payment of fee (As per G.O.(Ms) No.14/2005/SCSTDD dated 5.4.2005 & G.O.(Ms) No.36/07/SCSTDD dated 03.07.2007). Candidates belonging to OEC, admitted to merit seats through SEBC reservation are also exempted from payment of fee. (As per G.O. (Ms) No.50/2006/SCSTDD dated 22.09.2006).
- 12.3 Claim for fee concession to OEC Candidates: Candidates belonging to Other Eligible Communities (OEC) are exempted from payment of fee at the time of allotment to Under Graduate Programmes under Government/Community quota irrespective of annual family income as per G.O.(Ms) No.36/07/SCSTDD dated 03.07.2007. They should provide a copy of Community Certificate from the Village Officer along with the Application Form, in order to avail themselves of this benefit.
- 12.4 SC/ST/OEC candidates will have to pay the 'Caution Deposit' as per rules.
- 12.5 Contribution to CDC and PTA as per the rates decided by the respective committees shall also be remitted to the college at the time of admission.
