Undergraduate Prospectus 2024



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General Information

1. The College

- 1.1 Maharaja's College, Ernakulam is a government arts and science college and research centre in Kerala.
- 1.2 It is administered by the Directorate of Collegiate Education under Government of Kerala, hereinafter called 'Government'.
- 1.3 The college is affiliated to the Mahatma Gandhi University, Kottayam, hereinafter called 'University'.
- 1.4 From 2014, the college is an Autonomous College as per the UGC regulations, the only such government college in Kerala. Being an autonomous college, it has its own admission process, curriculum and examination system, but the final degree certificates are issued by the university.

2. About This Prospectus

- 2.1 This prospectus contains general information, provisions, procedures and other connected matters relating to the admission to the first year of the Four-Year Undergraduate Honours Programme (FYUGP) and also the five-year integrated programme of Maharaja's College, Ernakulam for the academic year 2024-25.
- 2.2 Provisions in any previous prospectus are not applicable for the year 2024-25.
- 2.3 The prospectus will be published on the online admission portal of the college. The prospectus will not be available in any other form including hard copy.
- 2.4 Applicants are required to go through the prospectus carefully and acquaint themselves with all the information relating to the admission procedure. They are also required to visit the admission portal (http:/maharajasonline.kerala.gov.in) as well as the website of the college (http:/maharajas.ac.in) regularly for notifications, announcements and updates.
- 2.5 All communications from the college are through email and/or SMS. Applicants should enter their email address and mobile phone number during application carefully. Applicants should also access their email and SMS regularly for any communication or update from the college.
- 2.6 Notwithstanding anything contained in this document, the admission into the college shall be subject to the regulations of the university and the orders of the Government from time to time, applicable to the college.
- 2.7 This prospectus is subject to modification, addition or deletion, as may be deemed necessary by the college. Any such changes will come into force after an order to that effect is issued.
- 2.8 Any items not specifically covered in this prospectus will be decided by the college, and such decision shall be final.
- 2.9 All disputes pertaining to the admission process shall fall within the jurisdiction of the High Court of Kerala.

3. The Four-Year Undergraduate Honours Programme (FYUGP)

- 3.1 In recognition of the requirement to strengthen undergraduate education, the college is launching Four-Year Undergraduate Programmes (FYUGP) from 2024-25 onwards.
- 3.2 The FYUGP will have the following three broad pathways:

- (a) Three-year Undergraduate Degree,
- (b) Four-year Undergraduate Degree (Honours), and
- (c) Four-year Undergraduate Degree (Honours with Research).
- 3.3 The FYUGP will have the following three major components:
 - (1) Foundation Courses grouped into four major baskets
 - (i) Ability Enhancement courses (AEC),
 - (ii) Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC),
 - (iii) Value Addition Courses (VAC),
 - (iv) Multidisciplinary Courses (MDC);
 - (2) Discipline Specific Courses (Major/Minor) and
 - (3) Discipline Specific Capstone level courses. Capstone level courses includes topics on specialized/advanced level, internships, community engagement and services, vocational training, professional training or other kinds of work experience.
- 3.4 Students can earn credit by completing remote learning modes, including online programs offered on the Study Webs of Active Learning for Young Aspiring Minds (SWAYAM: www.swayam.gov.in) or other online educational platforms approved by the competent body from time to time.
- 3.5 Students can opt for a change of major at the end of the second semester to any minor discipline studied among the foundation level courses. Students can also opt for a change of major at the end of the second semester to any MDC.
- 3.6 Students who choose to exit after three years shall be awarded an Undergraduate Degree in their respective major discipline after the successful completion of the required minimum number of courses with 133 Credits. Four-year Undergraduate Degree (Honours) in the discipline shall be awarded to those who complete the FYUGP with a specific number of courses with 177 credits. The candidates who acquire the minimum 75% in their graduation (upto 6th semester) are eligible for the Undergraduate (Honours with Research) Programme. The Undergraduate Degree (Honours with Research) shall be awarded to those who complete the program with specific number of courses and credits in their major discipline.
- 3.7 The integrated PG programme is a five-year programme with 10 semesters.
- 3.8 The FYUGP/integrated programmes offered by the college and for which admission process is governed by the provisions of this prospectus are given in **Table 1**.

- 3.9 B.Sc. Chemistry: Environment and Water Management Honours, and B.Sc. Physics Instrumentation Honours are cost-sharing (self-financing) programmes.
- 3.10The applicants to each programme should acquaint themselves with the structure and other details of the programme from the regulations, curriculum and syllabus published in the college website.

Eligibility

5. Age

5.1 There shall be no upper or lower age limit for admission to undergraduate programmes. However, for admission under the sports quota, the upper age limit is 25 years.

6. Academic

- 6.1 Academic eligibility should be satisfied as on the last date of submission of online application.
- 6.2 No applicant shall be admitted to the undergraduate or integrated programmes unless he/she possesses the qualifications and minimum requirements thereof.
- 6.3 For being admitted to any B.A. or the integrated programme, the applicant should have passed the Higher Secondary or equivalent examination as recognized by the Mahatma Gandhi University.
- 6.4 For being admitted to any B.Sc. programme, the applicant should have passed the Higher Secondary or equivalent examination as recognized by the Mahatma Gandhi University, and the core course they choose for the B.Sc. programme should be one of the subjects in the qualifying examination.
- 6.5 Applicants who have passed qualifying examinations other than the Kerala Higher Secondary Education, Kerala VHSE, Kerala THSE, CBSE, or CISCE shall be admitted only if those examinations have been declared equivalent to the qualifying examinations of Mahatma Gandhi University.
- 6.6 After the last date of submission of online application, an aptitude test will be conducted in the college for the applicants to B.A. Music programme to test their basic knowledge in Carnatic Music (from saptaswaras to alankaras). Applicants **not qualified** in the aptitude test shall not be considered for allotment of that programme. The marks obtained in the aptitude test shall also be included while calculating the index mark of that programme (See Clause 27.4).
- 6.7 Fractions in marks/percentages of marks shall not be rounded up while determining minimum eligibility.
- 6.8 The minimum academic eligibility for admission to each programme shall be as provided in **Table 2**.

^{6.9} If an applicant for admission is found to have indulged in ragging in the past or if it is noticed later that the applicant had indulged in ragging, admission shall be denied or the student shall be expelled from the college.

Seats and Reservation Quotas

7. Classification of Seats and Reservation Quotas

- 7.1 The seats available in undergraduate programmes are classified/reserved as under:
 - A. Special Reservation Seats
 - A.1 Sports Quota
 - A.2 Cultural Quota
 - B. General Merit Seats
 - B.1 Open Quota
 - B.2 Socially and Educationally Backward Classes Quota
 - i. Ezhava
 - ii. Muslim
 - iii. Other Backward Hindus
 - iv. Latin Catholic other than Anglo-Indians
 - v. Other Backward Christians
 - B.3 Scheduled Castes Quota
 - B.4 Scheduled Tribes Quota
 - B.5 Economically Weaker Sections Quota
 - C. Seats for Persons with Disabilities
 - D. Seats for Nominees from Lakshadweep
 - E. Seats for Transgender Persons
 - F. Seat for Persons from Govt. Children's Homes and Institutions under Juvenile Justice Act

8. Sports Quota (Special Reservation)

- 8.1 Two seats out of the sanctioned strength in each programme (Interchangeable) shall be reserved for applicants with outstanding records in sports and games. However, not more than 20% of the seats reserved for the open quota of a particular programme shall be filled under sports quota, when applying interchangeability for a particular programme.
- 8.2 The applicant for admission to sports quota should have won a minimum of third position (Bronze medal) in the school sub-district competition (inter-school) in addition to satisfying the academic eligibility.
- 8.3 Preference shall be given to applicants who have represented the State/National Meet over the applicants who have represented the District/School. The applicant shall produce all the relevant certificates to prove eligibility.
- 8.4 While calculating the rank list of applicants under the sports quota, the performance of the applicant during the 11th and 12th Class alone will be considered.
- 8.5 The guidelines for determining merit in sports for admission under the sports quota shall be as provided in **Appendix I.**

9. Cultural Quota (Special Reservation)

9.1 One seat out of the sanctioned strength in each programme (Interchangeable) shall be reserved for applicants who excel in youth festivals recognized by the Director of General Education, Kerala. However, not more than 10% of the seats reserved for the open quota of a particular programme shall be filled under cultural quota when applying interchangeability for a

- particular programme.
- 9.2 While calculating the rank list of applicants under the cultural quota, the performance of the applicant in any year during the study of the qualifying examination will be considered.
- **9.3** The criteria for preparing the rank list of applicants under cultural quota shall be as provided in **Appendix II.**

10. General Merit Seats

10.1 Leaving the seats set apart for special reservation, the remaining seats of each programme are General Merit seats, which shall be distributed as given in **Table 3**.

- 10.2The seat reservation shall be in accordance with the provisions contained in relevant orders of Government of Kerala issued or amended from time to time.
- 10.3 Claim for seat reservation must be made by applicants at the time of submission of application. The claim for reservation once made cannot be altered later by the applicant under any circumstances.

11. Open Quota

11.1 All applicants included in the rank lists are eligible for admission under the Open Quota. Applicants might be eligible for admission under other reservation quotas also (SEBC, SC, ST or EWS). An applicant eligible for admission under the open quota will be admitted under the open quota, even if the applicant may be eligible under another quota of the same programme. An applicant not eligible for SEBC, SC, ST or EWS reservation will be considered against the open quota.

12. Socially and Educationally Backward Classes (SEBC) Quota

- 12.1Twenty percent of the General Merit seats are reserved for applicants belonging to Socially and Educationally Backward Classes (SEBC) of Kerala. Applicants belonging to SEBC as per G.O. (P) 208/1966/Edn dated 02.05.1966, amended from time to time, only are eligible for reservation under this category. The seats are distributed among different communities as provided in G.O. (MS) 107/2008/HEDN dated 30.08.2008.
- 12.2Applicants satisfying Non-Creamy Layer criteria only are eligible for claiming reservation under SEBC category (G.O. (P) 02/2017/BCDD dated 08.03.2017). Applicants claiming reservation under SEBC should produce valid community/caste certificate and also the non-

- creamy layer certificate issued by the competent authority of Revenue Department (Village Officer or above) at the time of admission. The validity of Non-Creamy Layer certificate is one year from the date of issue.
- 12.3The list of communities eligible for claiming admission under SEBC is given in **Appendix III.** Only the claims of the applicants belonging to the communities in the list will be considered.

13. Economically Weaker Sections Quota

13.1Ten percent of General Merit seats are reserved for the Economically Weaker Sections (EWS) who are not covered under other schemes of reservation (SC/ST/SEBC). Applicants claiming reservation under EWS quota should produce the relevant 'Income & Assets Certificate' or the 'Anthyodaya Anna Yojana (AAY) and Priority House Hold (PHH) Category' certificate from the revenue authority concerned at the time of admission. (GO (MS) No. 128/2020/HEDN dated 20/03/2020)

14. Scheduled Castes Quota

- 14.1Fifteen percent of the General Merit seats are reserved for applicants belonging to Scheduled Castes of Kerala. Applicants claiming reservation under Scheduled Castes quota should produce valid community/caste certificate obtained from the revenue authority concerned at the time of admission.
- 14.2The list of communities eligible for claiming admission under Scheduled Castes quota is given in **Appendix IV.** Only the claims of the applicants belonging to the communities in the list will be considered.

15. Scheduled Tribes Quota

- 15.1Five percent of the General Merit seats are reserved for applicants belonging to Scheduled Tribes of Kerala. Applicants claiming reservation under Scheduled Tribes quota should produce valid community/caste certificate obtained from the revenue authority concerned at the time of admission.
- 15.2The list of communities eligible for claiming admission under Scheduled Tribes quota is given in **Appendix V.** Only the claims of the applicants belonging to the communities in the list will be considered.

16. Seats for Persons with Disabilities

- 16.1 Five percent seats shall be created over and above the sanctioned strength in all programmes exclusively for applicants with benchmark disability (as per clause 32 (l) of chapter VI, The Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016).
- 16.2Persons with Disabilities means a person suffering from not less than 40% of any disability as certified by a Medical Board constituted for this purpose. Applicants who have a minimum of 40% disability alone will be eligible for this quota. A relaxation of 5% marks in the qualifying examination from the prescribed minimum is allowed.
- 16.3 Applicants seeking admission under Persons with Disabilities category should submit the 'Certificate of Disability', issued not earlier than 5 years prior to the submission of application, by the District Medical Board or bodies of higher status, certifying percentage of disability. The 'Certificate of Disability' should be uploaded along with the online application. Based on the details furnished in the online application, applicants will be provisionally included under

- the Persons with Disabilities category.
- 16.4The selection of applicants under this category will be based on the rank in the inter-se-merit list and not on the basis of the degree of disability.
- 16.5No reservation of seats is allowed for blind applicants for B.Sc. programmes.

17. Seats for Nominees from UT of Lakshadweep

17.1 An additional seat shall be created in each programme exclusively for the purpose of admitting applicants sponsored by the Union Territory of Lakshadweep. Applicants to this seat should produce the nomination letter from the competent authority of the Union Territory of Lakshadweep.

18. Seats for Transgender Persons

18.1Two seats shall be created over and above the sanctioned strength in all programmes exclusively for admitting transgender applicants (G.O. (MS) 153/2018/HEDN dated 03.07.2018).

19. Seats for Persons from Govt. Children's Homes and Institutions under Juvenile Justice Act

19.1One seat shall be created over and above the sanctioned strength in the college exclusively for admitting applicants from Government Children's Homes and institutions functioning under Juvenile Justice Act. Such applicants should submit certificates to prove their claim.

20. Seats Not Availed under Reservation

- 20.1 The seats not availed by eligible applicants under the Sports Quota shall be merged into the General Merit seats of the programme.
- 20.2The seats not availed by eligible applicants under the Cultural Quota shall be merged into the General Merit seats of the programme.
- 20.3 The seats not availed by eligible applicants under the SEBC Quota shall be allotted under the Open Quota of the programme.
- 20.4The seats not availed by eligible applicants under the EWS Quota shall be allotted under the Open Quota of the programme.
- 20.5If sufficient applicants are not available for filling the seats reserved for Persons with Disabilities, Nominees from Lakshadweep, Transgender Persons, and Persons from Govt. Children's Homes & Institutions under Juvenile Justice Act, such seats shall not be filled from any other categories.

21. Seats Not Availed by SC/ST Applicants

- 21.1The seats unavailed by the SC applicants will go to ST applicants and vice versa. The unavailed seats reserved for SC/ST shall be re-notified twice through print media and a special allotment shall be conducted exclusively for filling up vacant seats of SC/ST applicants. If such seats are remaining vacant even after re-notification, these shall be filled up from applicants belonging to OEC.
- 21.2The OEC (SC) and OEC (ST) applicants who claim allotment under SC and ST quota respectively as above, should specify their community status in the online application, and also should furnish community/caste certificate obtained from the revenue authority concerned at the time of admission.
- 21.3 Applicants belonging to OEC (SC) and OEC (ST) are also eligible for educational concessions

- available for SC and ST communities, irrespective of their family income. They should provide caste/community certificate from the competent authority at the time of admission for availing the concessions (See Clause 41.2).
- 21.4The list of communities belonging to OEC (SC) is given in **Appendix VI**, and the list of communities belonging to OEC (ST) is given in **Appendix VII**. Only the claims of the applicants belonging to the communities in the list will be considered.

Application Process

22. Online Application

- 22.1 The application process for admission to all the undergraduate and integrated programmes is fully online for all categories of applicants. The online application should be made from the admission portal (http://maharajasonline.kerala.gov.in) of the college.
- 22.2Only one application can be submitted by an applicant. Application to all eligible programmes (subject to a specified maximum) shall be made in the single online application.
- 22.3 All categories of applicants should register and apply online, and upload the required documents online.

23. Registration

- 23.1Before submitting the application, all applicants should register in the online portal. For registration, the email address, mobile phone number, category and such minimum basic details of the applicant should be provided. Since all communications from the college shall be through email or SMS, the applicants should enter their email and mobile phone number very carefully, and regularly check the email and SMS for any communication from the college.
- 23.2An application fee at the following rates should be paid online by the applicant to complete the registration process.

Application fee for Scheduled Castes or Scheduled Tribes: Rs. 50

Application fee for all other applicants: Rs. 100

23.3 The application fee once remitted shall not be refunded under any circumstances.

24. Application Form

- 24.1 After registration and payment of the application fee, the applicants can login to the website using the email address as username. After logging in, the other basic personal and academic details of the applicant need to be entered.
- 24.2 Applicants have to upload a recent photograph, signature and required documents also.

25. Order of Preference

25.1 Applicants can choose the programmes which they are applying to. Applicants can choose a maximum of five eligible programmes as per their preference. Applicants should choose the programmes as well as the order of preference carefully, since allotments to the programmes will be based on the preference order.

26. Submission of Application

- 26.1 Claims that are not mentioned at the time of submission of online application will not be considered under any circumstances, even if supporting evidences are produced later on.
- 26.2 Any kind of false information may lead to cancellation of admission at any stage.
- 26.3 Before submitting, the applicants should verify the details furnished and the order of programmes preference. After verification, the application can be submitted.
- 26.4Upon successful submission, an application form will be generated containing an application number. The printout of the application form (with application number) should be kept by the applicants, and should be submitted at the time of admission along with other documents.
- 26.5 The printout of the application shall not be sent to the college.

Index marks and Rank List

27. Index Marks

- 27.1 At the close of the application, index mark of all the eligible applicants will be calculated for preparing the rank list.
- 27.2 While calculating index mark, mark obtained in the qualifying examinations of boards other than the Kerala State Higher Secondary Education, such as CBSE and CISCE, shall be standardised to that of Kerala Higher Secondary Examination where the maximum mark is 1200.
- 27.3 Mark obtained for vocational / technical subjects in VHSE, THSE, etc. shall be excluded while calculating index mark.
- 27.4For the applicants to B.A. Music programme, the mark obtained in the aptitude test shall also be included while calculating the index mark of that programme (See Clause 6.6). There shall be 50% weightage each for the marks in the qualifying examination and the aptitude test; both the marks will be standardised out of 1200 for the purpose. Applicants not qualified in the aptitude test shall not be considered for allotment in B.A. Music.

28. Bonus Marks

- 28.1A bonus of 15 marks shall be added while calculating the index mark of the ex-servicemen applicants and widows and children of Jawans and ex-servicemen. Applicants to this category should invariably produce an attested copy of certificate issued not earlier than six months from the last date of submission of application from the military authorities or state/Zilla Sainik Welfare Officer to the effect that he/she is the son/daughter of an ex-service man or an ex-service man himself/herself.
- 28.2Bonus marks as detailed below shall be added while calculating the index mark for all programmes, if the applicant has a valid NCC, NSS, Scouts/Guides/Rover/Ranger or Student Police Cadet certificate, obtained for activities during their study of the qualifying examination, subject to the condition that the bonus marks can be claimed under any one of these categories only:
 - 28.2.1 A bonus mark of 15 shall be added for applicants with NCC certificate signed by the Director and issued by the Directorate of NCC to those who have secured at least 75% attendance after having participated in its activities during the programme of study immediately preceding the programme for which admission is sought. An additional bonus mark of 5 shall be awarded to NCC 'B' Certificate holders.
 - 28.2.2 For applicants with the valid NSS Certificates, a bonus of 15 marks shall be added while calculating the index mark for all programmes. The NSS Certificate should be issued by the competent authority to the applicants for activities during their study of the qualifying examination.
 - 28.2.3 For applicants with valid Rajyapuraskar/Nanmamudra certificates in Scouts/Guides/Rover/Ranger, a bonus of 15 marks shall be added while calculating the index mark for all programmes. The Certificate should be issued by the competent authority to the applicants for activities during their study of the qualifying examination. No certificate other than Rajyapuraskar/Nanmamudra

- shall be considered for the purpose.
- 28.2.4 For applicants with the valid Student Police Cadets Certificates, the bonus mark of 15 shall be added while calculating the index mark for all programmes. The Certificate should be issued by the competent authority to the applicants for activities during their study of the qualifying examination.
- 28.3 Any bonus marks shall be added only if the applicant has obtained the prescribed minimum qualifying marks in the qualifying examination.
- 28.4The applicants claiming any bonus mark should produce the certificate concerned in original at the time of admission for verification.

29. Negative Mark

29.1 Negative mark is the mark to be deducted while calculating the index mark of an applicant on account of acquiring the required academic qualifications in subsequent chances following the regular chance. In the case of those who have taken two or more chances to complete the examination, five marks each for every additional attempt after the first attempt, subject to a maximum of 20 marks, shall be deducted while calculating the index mark. Accordingly, the negative marks will be as given in the following table:

- 29.2An additional attempt means any attempt for passing any part of the qualifying examination after the prescribed programme period. Appearance for improvement of marks shall not be considered as an additional attempt.
- 29.3No marks will be deducted for SAY pass outs if admitted in the same academic year but five marks shall be deducted if he/she is ranked in the admission list of the succeeding year.
- 29.4Applicants who have passed the qualifying examination under SAY scheme or such supplementary schemes are eligible to apply for the UG programmes in the same academic year.

- 30.19 For calculating the index mark for all programmes, marks obtained in the qualifying examinations shall be standardised to that of Kerala Higher Secondary Examination where the maximum mark is 1200 as provided under Clause 27.2.

31. Tie-breaking Principles

- 31.1To decide relative rank among applicants having the same index mark for a programme, following tie-breaking principles will be applied one after another in the given order:
 - 31.1.1 The applicant with higher mark in the subject concerned in the qualifying examination shall be placed higher in ranking. For B.Com, Business Studies (Commerce) shall be considered as the elective subject.
 - 31.1.2 The applicant with higher mark in Part III subjects (or the subjects other than languages, if Part is not specified) taken together shall be placed higher in ranking.
 - 31.1.3 The applicant with higher mark in Part I (mark of English, if Part is not specified) shall be placed higher in ranking.
 - 31.1.4 The applicant with higher mark in Part II (mark of the Additional Language if Part is not specified) shall be placed higher in ranking.

- 31.1.5 By giving residential weightage (at District/State Levels)
- 31.1.6 The applicant who is older shall be placed higher in the rank list. The age difference shall be calculated in completed years only, rounding down fractions.
- 31.1.7 The applicant who generated the application number first shall be placed higher in ranking.

32. Draft Eligibility List

- 32.1 At the close of the application, a draft eligibility list for all programmes will be published in the website on the basis of index marks, for verification by the applicants.
- 32.2After the publication of the draft eligibility list, applicants will be permitted to modify, if needed, certain portions of the online application through their profile within the prescribed time period.

33. Rank List

33.1 At the close of the time granted for editing the online application, the final rank list of each programme will be published.

Allotment Process

34. First Allotment

- 34.1 The first allotment list shall be published on the website on the date to be notified. Applicants have to check the details of allotment. Allotment list consists of only those applicants who are provisionally selected for admission to a programme under each category. Inclusion of the name in an allotment list does not necessarily ensure admission; admission shall be subject to physical verification of documents for eligibility, other claims, and payment of required fees.
- 34.2 Applicants included in the allotment list will be given two options: either 'accept' or 'decline' the admission in the currently allotted programme. Applicants who wish to join the allotted programme should accept the allotment. Those who do not wish to join the current allotment should invariably decline the current allotment and wait for further allotments.
- 34.3 Those applicants who neither 'accept' nor 'decline' the allotment received within the time period will not be considered for any further allotment or admission.

35. Cancellation of Preferences after an Allotment

- 35.1 With publication of an allotment, all the preferences lower than the allotted one will automatically be removed from the preference list of the applicant. For example, if an applicant had registered 3 preferences in all, and is allotted the 2nd preferred programme, then the 3rd preferred programme will be automatically removed. The first preferred programme will remain valid and will be considered in future allotments.
- 35.2If an applicant who is included in an allotment does not want to be considered for further allotments in higher preferred programmes, the applicant may cancel the remaining higher preferences, fully or partially, before the next allotment and within the prescribed time. If not cancelled, the applicant will be considered in further allotments. For example, if an applicant is allotted the 3rd preferred programme, and the applicant does not want admission in the 2nd preferred programme, he/she may cancel preference 2, but retain preference 1. Preference 1 will remain valid and will be considered for future allotments.
- 35.3 The facility for cancellation of higher preferences shall be available during the notified period only.
- 35.4An applicant retaining any of the higher preferences after an allotment, is bound to accept the new allotment in the that preference, if received. In the event of the new allotment, the previous allotment will be automatically cancelled.
- 35.5A student first admitted in a programme against Sports Quota, Cultural Quota, Seat for Persons with Disabilities, Seat for Nominees from Lakshadweep, or Seat for Transgender Persons, shall not be included in further allotments under SC/ST/SEBC/EWS quota, if applicable, of the same programme. However, such applicants shall be considered for allotment under the open quota of the same programme, and also in allotments to the retained higher preferences, if any, under any quota.

36. Allotment Memo

36.1 Applicants who 'accept' the allotment can download the allotment memo from their profile. The allotment memo has to be produced at the time of admission.

37. Reporting for Admission

- 37.1 After allotments, all applicants who downloaded the allotment memo shall be directed to report at the department concerned of the college for admission on a specified date and time. At the time of admission, applicants have to produce all certificates/documents, including allotment memo, required to prove their claims in the application, and pay the fees.
- 37.2 Those who fail to report will lose their claim for admission and further allotments.

38. Verification of Documents

38.1The Head of the Department concerned shall verify the correctness of the records produced by the applicant at the time of admission.

39. Supplementary Allotments

- 39.1 Supplementary allotments are made if there are unfilled seats in any category for a programme after the start of admissions. Applicants who get allotment in supplementary/further allotments shall follow the instructions in the above clauses.
- 39.2If there are unfilled seats in any category for a programme after supplementary allotments, spot allotments for the applicants included in the rank list shall be conducted at time and date specified later.

Fees

40. Types

- 40.1 In addition to the application fee collected at the time of online registration or allotments, the college collects various fees during the time of admission.
- 40.2Fee for various programmes will be decided by the State Government /university and the amount given in this prospectus is subject to changes.

41. Fee Concessions

41.1 Applicants belonging to the following categories are exempted from payment of various fees irrespective of the quota against which they are admitted.

- 41.2 Applicants belonging to SC, ST, OEC (SC) and OEC (ST) are excepted from fee payment irrespective of the annual income. Those applicants should submit valid caste/community certificate from the competent authority at the time of admission for availing the concessions.
- 41.3The educational concessions available for the OEC (SC/ST) are applicable to 30 OBH communities also, provided the annual income is not more than Rs 6 lakh (G.O. (MS) 10/2014/BCDD dated 23.05.2014 and G.O. (MS) 7/2016/BCDD dated 25.08.2016). But applicants belonging to those 30 communities are not eligible for admission against the unavailed seats of SC or ST Quota as available for OEC (SC/ST) as per G.O. (MS) 14/2017/BCDD dated 02.08.2017. For availing the concessions, the applicants should produce valid community certificate as well as income certificate as above at the time of admission. The list of the 30 communities is given in **Appendix VIII**.
- 41.4Any other applicant can claim educational concessions as per the Kumara Pillai Commission Report (KPCR), if the annual income is not more than Rs 1 lakh (G.O. (MS) 6/2014/BCDD dated 21.02.2014 and G.O. (MS) 15/2014/BCDD dated 08.08.2014). For availing the concessions, applicants should produce valid income certificate as above at the time of admission. However, Special Fee, Caution Deposit, CDC Fund and PTA Fund are collected from these applicants.
- 41.5SC/ST/OEC candidates will have to pay the 'Caution Deposit' as per rules.
- 41.6The amount towards the CDC fund and PTA fund will be as per the rates decided by the respective committees.
- 41.7Amounts of various fee components for the first year of the undergraduate/integrated programmes, payable at the time admission, are given in **Appendix IX**.

Appendix I: Sports Quota Criteria

Guidelines for determining merit in sports of applicants under the Sports Quota (Clause 8)

The following guidelines shall be followed in determining merit in sports for admission to the UG programmes. Marks shall be awarded for the sports merit certificates as detailed in the following Table.

- A) Minimum eligibility for admission of an applicant to undergraduate programmes (Sports Quota) will be winning a minimum of third position in the school sub district competition (Inter-school) in addition to his/her satisfying academic eligibility.
- B) For securing admission to UG programmes under Sports Quota, the performance of the applicant at 11th and 12th standards alone will be considered.

- 7. Priority will be given for students having achievements in senior level competitions than junior and youth category competitions.
- 8. Resolving of Tie: If the points of more than one applicant happen to be the same, then for breaking the "tie", the following criteria shall be followed one after another in the order given below:
 - a) A person can score points only in one category.
 - b) The highest score will be counted
 - c) Where bracketed, scores in other categories will be counted
 - d) Where still bracketed, priority will be given in the order of merit i.e.; 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place respectively.
 - e) Those with a more number of achievements in the same level will be placed above the others (more number of 1st places, more number of 2nd places and so on).
 - f) Individual achievements will be ranked above team achievements.
 - g) A new record is created; he/she will be given priority.
 - If the tie could not be resolved by any of the above-mentioned sports achievements, the index marks based on the qualifying examination shall be considered for breaking the tie.
- 9. Performance in any year during the Plus One/Plus Two level will be taken into consideration.
- 10.If any discrepancy is noted during the verification of original certificates, the applicant shall not be considered for admission under sports quota.
